Maxine Cochran – this is *Malva sylvestris* or the common mallow also called the Marshmallow bush.



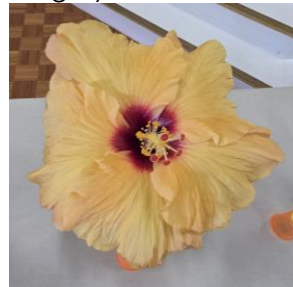
SEC. 10 - DISPLAY (x1)

Wendy Bruce – a very large yellow hibiscus.

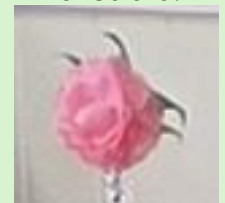


STEWARDS' PRIZE
