## Competition Rules for 2021

## The competition is for members to exhibit the fruits of their gardening activities under ten categories.

1. Entry to the Competition Tables is only open to financial members of the Robina Garden Club Inc.
2. Up to a maximum of 2 entries per member per section is permitted.
3. Entries are to be benched no later than 12.15 p.m.

No late entries will be accepted.
4. Entrants are responsible for putting their name on a piece of paper (upside down) under each entry. If you can, name the entry also.
5. Place your entry in the correct section but its final placement is decided by the Stewards so that all exhibits are fairly displayed.
Under no circumstances should an exhibitor shift other entries.
6. Each exhibitor is to collect a ticket from the stewards for entry into the Exhibitor's Raffle. Prize $=\$ 5$.
7. There are ten sections available for entries -

| SECTION 8 | - | A Vase of Flowers |
| SECTION 9 | - | Small Pot Plant |
| SECTION 10 | - | Floral Art |

8. JANUARY ONLY - A HUMOROUS ARRANGEMENT
9. The 'rules' governing entries into each section are attached. The Stewards use these descriptions to decide if an entry is a valid entry or has to be removed/shifted.
10. Members and visitors judge the entries with one vote per section.
11. In the case of 'pots' a winning entry cannot be re-submitted for at least 3 months. This does not apply to ‘cuts' - for example a second rose from the same tree counts as a different entry and thus can be submitted next month.
12. Points are normally recorded monthly, totalled at the end of the year and prizes (including the Annual Trophy) are awarded at the AGM the next year. Due to the Covid-19 and limited numbers to the club. This will be restructured for 2021 and a cash prize of $\$ 5$ will be given to the winner of each category on the day.

The Benching Officials only are responsible for the final positioning of all entries for judging. In the event of a dispute the President has the final decision.

## MONTHLY FEATURES

| JANUARY | Ferns <br> - A fern/s of any type in any type of container e.g. in a pot, on a piece of wood, in an old shoe, etc. <br> - Must be from your own garden and have been owned by you for at least three months. <br> - Bring your own stand/stool if it is a hanging pot and needs to be put up. |

| FEBRUARY | Coleus <br> - A collection of coleus cuttings displayed as you wish in a vase or container of any type. Can be a 'pot' of Coleus plants. <br> - Can be one type only or a collection of different types of Coleus. <br> - Must be from plants you have been growing for at least three months. |
| MARCH | Bromeliad <br> - All Bromeliads must be entered in this section this month. <br> - Includes Bromeliad species of all types e.g. Tillandsias, Guzmanias, etc. <br> - Must be one single type of plant (however can include pups) which can be in a growing medium of any type or on a log etc. <br> - Leaves cannot be manipulated e.g. polished, waxed, etc. |
| APRIL | Hibiscus and/or Roses <br> - A single Rose or Hibiscus or a collection of Hibiscus and/or Roses from your own garden. They can be presented with or without leaves. <br> - Must be from plants you have been growing for at least three months. <br> - Can be displayed in any type of container/vase. |
| MAY | Miniature Garden <br> - Two or more different plants arranged or growing in any sized single container and arranged to represent a 'garden scene'. <br> - No artificial plants allowed but can include `paths'/fences' etc. \\ - Must be a `garden' that you planted up at least three months ago. |
| JUNE | Cactus and/or Succulent Garden <br> - A collection of at least two different types of Cactus and/or Succulents growing in a container of some kind. <br> - Must have been growing in that container for at least 3 months. |
| JULY | Anthurium <br> - A single Anthurium plant growing in any type of container/pot. <br> - With or without a flower. <br> - Must have been owned by you for at least three months. |
| AUGUST | Begonia <br> - A Begonia of any type growing in/on any type of container or pot. Plant and its 'offshoots' can be as large as you like provided it is one type. <br> - With or without a flower. <br> - Must have been owned by you for at least three months. |
| SEPTEMBER | Natives <br> - A Native growing in a pot (flower or no flower) or a vase of any mix of Native flowers. <br> - If a plant, it must have been growing in that container for at least 3 months. If cut foliage, the plant/s must have been owned for at least three months. |
| OCTOBER | Hippeastrum. <br> - Exhibits must be from a plant you have owned for at least 3 months. <br> - Can be in a pot or a cut in a vase of some kind and can be staked/supported to hold the bloom firmly. <br> - Must be one single stem with one `bloom' only (single or double type). |
| NOVEMBER | Croton <br> - Can be either a single potted plant or a cut from a plant that has been growing in your garden for at least three months. <br> - The aim is to display the quality and colour/s of the leaves/plant. <br> - Leaves cannot be manipulated in any way e.g. polished, waxed, etc. |
